## Village of Trumansburg and Environmental Design and Research Receives Comprehensive Planning Award

The award recognizes the Village of Trumansburg Comprehensive Plan for advancing the science and art of comprehensive planning for Upstate New York. The award celebrates group achievements based on the plan's originality and innovation, public engagement, education of community planning, implementation, and effectiveness of the plan in making a difference in the lives of people.

The Village of Trumansburg Comprehensive Plan presents an inclusive vision for a community invested in its people and places. The plan utilizes that vision as a roadmap for future actions to be undertaken within the village. It addressed the local need to update the 2008 comprehensive plan with updated information that reflected current challenges faced by the Village of Trumansburg (e.g., housing, climate change, and social equity). The plan recommends innovative solutions, such as accessory dwelling units and other tools to promote housing affordability, greenhouse gas reductions for climate change mitigation, increased and improved recreational amenities, improved stormwater management systems, and other measures that improve the quality of life.

"The Comprehensive Plan Revision Committee as a group faced the challenge of fulfilling their mandate while navigating the COVID pandemic and the numerous restrictions put in place in response to the health crisis." Rordan Hart, Mayor of Village of Trumansburg, stated. "The group also had to operate in an environment of heightened concern and awareness with respect to very large societal issues including national and regional housing shortages, social inequity, and climate change. The Comprehensive Plan developed by this committee boldly addresses each of these issues, while promoting livability, accessibility, and financial sustainability for our small community."
